WINTER REMINDERS

Lamp Post Light Fixture Replacement or Repair: For neighborhood safety, it is a Lake Pointe HOA requirement that your lamp post must be lit from dusk until dawn. If your light is not working, you can replace it with a similar size, color and quality fixture, or you can rebuild your exisiting light fixture for \$75 by contacting HOA member Don Dorsan at ddorsan@gmail.com.

Observe & Report Suspicious People, Cars or Activity: Call the Franklin Police Department non-emergency number at 414-425-2522 and alert your neighbors as well as the HOA. If there is a life-threatening emergency, call 911.

Snow & Ice Removal: Homeowners are required by city ordinane to clean sidewalks along property lines, removing snow and ice within 24 hours after snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumuate. If ice cannot be removed, ensure safety by applying salt.

Winter Parking: Winter parking regulations begin December 1. In the City of Franklin, winter parking rules prohibit street parking between 2:00 am and 7:00 am Monday through Saturday, and between 3:00 am and 7:00 am on Sunday.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL RESTRICTION AMENDMENT APPROVED

The short-term rental amendment to the Lake Pointe Estates Declaration of Restrictions and Covenants has been approved with 61 (67%) of the 91 owners signing the petition to amend. This exceeds the 65% requirement required under section 9 of the Restrictions and Covenants. Sixteen owners stated they were not in favor when asked and 14 were not available or did not respond. The Board has adopted the resolution and the next step is to file the amendment with the Milwaukee County Register of Deeds. A copy of the resolution has been posted on the website at lakepointe.webador.com. The Board thanks the volunteers who worked on the amendment to restrict short-term rentals at Lake Pointe Estates.

FRANKLIN COMMUNITY & RECREATION DEPARTMENT BUILDING & SOCCER FIELD EXPANSION PROJECT

The project has begun construction on the former Luxembourg Garden's property immediately north of Lake Pointe Estates. This project will give the Recreation Department much needed interior program space as well as play field space for community use. The Lake Pointe Board is looking into how the wetlands adjacent to the subdivision will be affected as well as water runoff from the development into the Lake Pointe Estates pond. BEWARE OF THIN ICE ON THE POND

Wisconsin winter temperatures do fluctuate and thaws are common. Always use caution when venturing out on the ice in winter. Before walking on the ice, do a visual inspection. Do not go out on the ice, if you see: cracks, breaks or holes in the ice, water on top of the ice, water flowing onto the ice, or ice that's soft or mushy.
