RECIPE BOX: RASPBERRY ASPARAGUS MEDLEY

Asparagus being a spring vegetable, this goes great with picnics and hearty meals like Easter. Serves about 6. (Recipe by Cooking Light)

Ingredients:


- 1 Tbsp white wine vinegar
- 2 Tbsp raspberry preserves
- 1 ½ tsp Dijon mustard
- 1/8 tsp salt (use kosher salt)
- ½ tsp grated lemon rind
- 2 ½ cup sliced asparagus (appx. 1lb.keep whole or cut into pieces)
- 1 ½ cup fresh raspberries
- 2 Tbsp finely chopped toasted pecans

Directions:

- Combine first 4 ingredients in sauce pan and bring to a boil
- Remove from heat and stir in lemon rind
- In a separate, large frying pan cook asparagus in boiling water for 2 minutes
- Remove asparagus from hot water, drain and place in ice water bath; then drain
- Combine preserve mixture, asparagus, and raspberries in a bowl and toss to coat. Sprinkle with pecans.
